Pre-Sessional English

Our Pre-Sessional English programme is designed to build your English language abilities ready for undergraduate or postgraduate study.

You will develop academic English skills in a content-based approach to learning involving critical thinking, questioning, discussion, reflection and analysis. You will also develop the ideas and concepts necessary to participate in the global academic community.

- Improve your academic study skills, in addition to your reading, writing, listening and speaking skills
- Introduce yourself to life in the UK and to British culture
- Develop your understanding of university systems, services and facilities

This full-time programme is ideal if your academic qualifications meet the requirements for your chosen undergraduate or postgraduate course, but your English language level falls below the entry requirements of the academic course you wish to join. The programme teaches you the language and other academic skills necessary for you to gain the maximum benefit from your future academic course.

How will I be taught and assessed?

A particular emphasis is placed on reading and writing academic English and you will be supported in producing extended writing as part of your assessment. You will develop these skills in a content-based approach to learning involving critical thinking, questioning, discussion, reflection and analysis. You will also develop the ideas and concepts necessary to participate in the global academic community.

You will also be assigned your own Guidance Tutor who will provide academic and pastoral support and be your first point of contact if you have questions or problems.

Careers and further study

Progression on to your chosen academic course depends on a mix of continuous assessment and end-of-semester examinations (not IELTS).

Example modules:

The Pre-Sessional English programme consists of the modules listed below, all of which are core:

- English and Study Skills
- Reading Skills
- Writing Skills
- Researching Life in Britain

All modules are core and are worth 0 credits.

Top-Up degrees

There are lots of different routes in to higher education, each depending on what qualifications you hold, and at which level.

If you currently hold an HND, Foundation Degree or equivalent Level 5 qualification, you may be able to join one of our Top-Up degrees. These programmes are the final year of an undergraduate degree. They will build upon your knowledge and skills from your previous qualification and are a very popular choice amongst students looking to progress and achieve an undergraduate degree with just one year of study.

If you are interested in a systems development and management career and currently hold a Foundation Degree or HND (Higher National Diploma) or equivalent, the BSc (Hons) Applied Computing (Top-Up) allows you to gain a full undergraduate degree within one year of study.

Throughout the course you will study a wide range of topics, from systems development and strategic systems management, to social and current issues in computing, as well as professional management and practice. You will also complete a case project, which will provide you with the opportunity to apply all of your existing skills to a substantial software development problem.

How will I be taught and assessed?

This course is taught using a range of methods, including: lectures, seminars and practical workshops, where you will develop your skills. Each module of study is assessed by coursework assignments. The individual project may be initiated by the university, the student, or an external client and consists of an end product and a report explaining and evaluating the project process.

Careers and further study

Upon successful completion of this course, with a minimum of a 2:2 degree, you will be eligible to further your understanding of this subject area with the option to progress on to our MSc Cyber Security programme or MSc Computing and Information Technology (for more details please see pages 43 and 44).

After completing the Top-Up programme, you will also be well placed to pursue a career in a wide range of business or computing-focused roles, for example, in systems and application development, computer programming or project management.

If you are interested in the world of business and its many applications, this course allows you to further your achievements gained from either a HND (Higher National Diploma) in Business, a Foundation Degree, SQA HND, or equivalent qualification. The Top-Up programme gives you the opportunity to continue studying business at degree level, achieving a bachelors within one year of study.

Throughout the course you will study a variety of different topics, each designed to develop your understanding of business and build the key skills that today's employers expect from top-calibre graduate recruits.

How will I be taught and assessed?

The course will be taught using a variety of teaching and learning strategies to encourage and develop your independent learning skills. You will be assessed based on coursework and a project. The project is supported by taught sessions on research methods and allows you to select a topic of interest to you.

Careers and further study

If you pass with a minimum of a 2:2 and would like to continue your studies, you may be eligible to progress on to one of our postgraduate business degrees at the London Campus, please see page 34 for more information. Alternatively, if you do not achieve a minimum of a 2:2 you might be eligible to study our Pre-Masters programme. Upon successful completion of your Pre-Masters course, subject to a minimum pass mark, you will be guaranteed a place on one of our selected Masters programmes. Please see page 32 for more information.

Upon graduation of the Business Top-Up you could also enter a career in consultancy, marketing, health management, human resource management or operations management, as well as having the skills to set-up your own business.

Advanced Practice

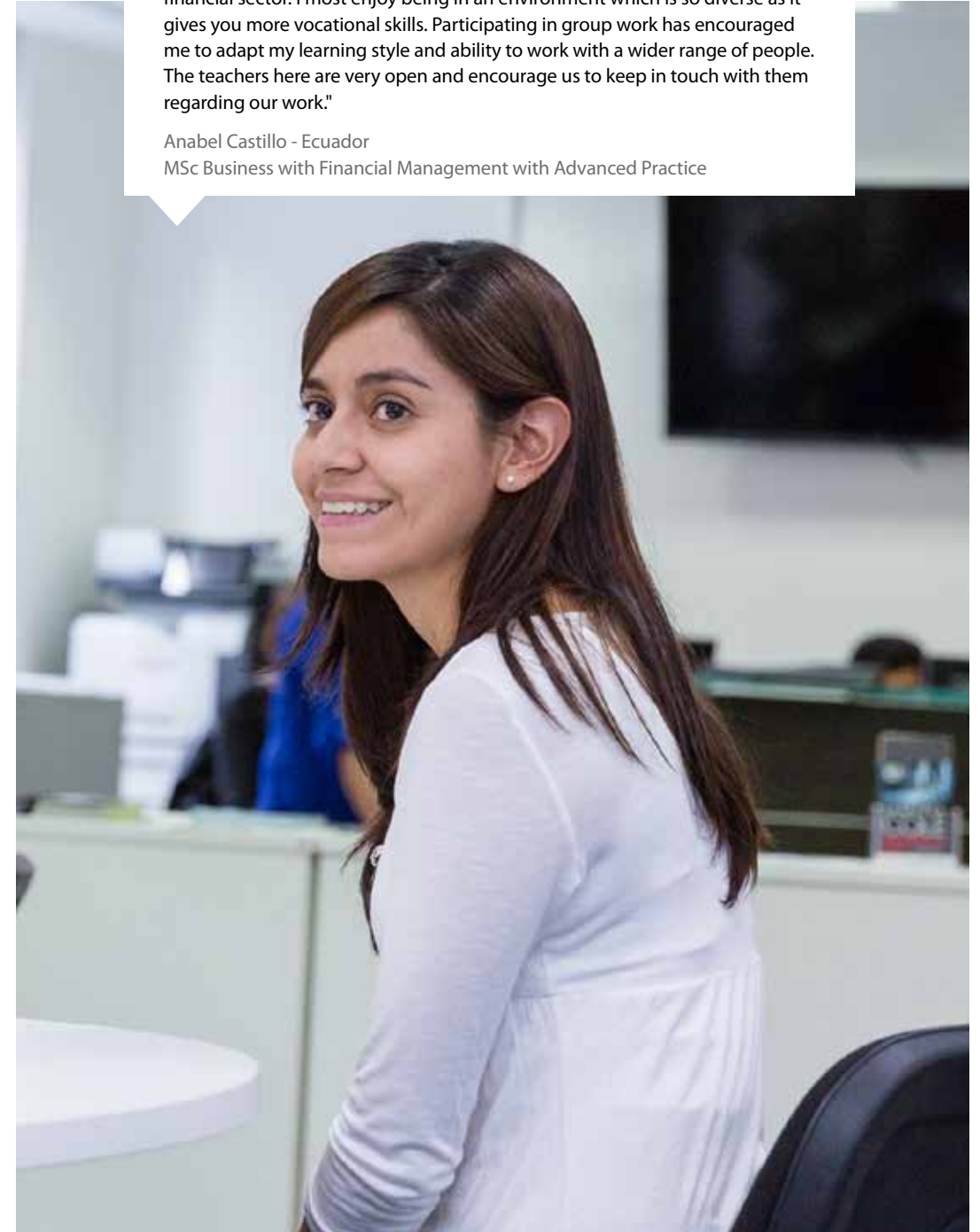

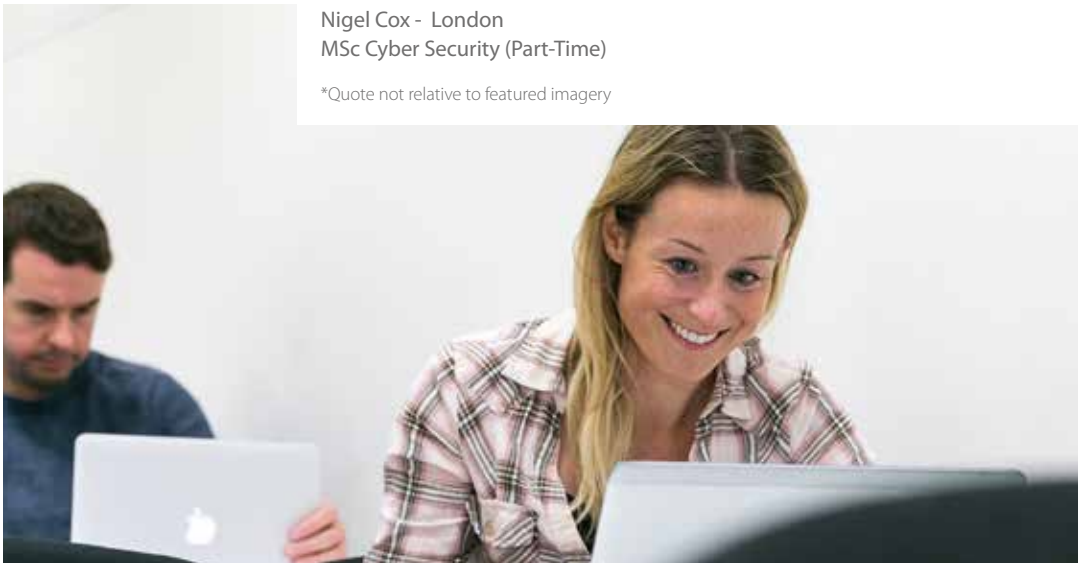

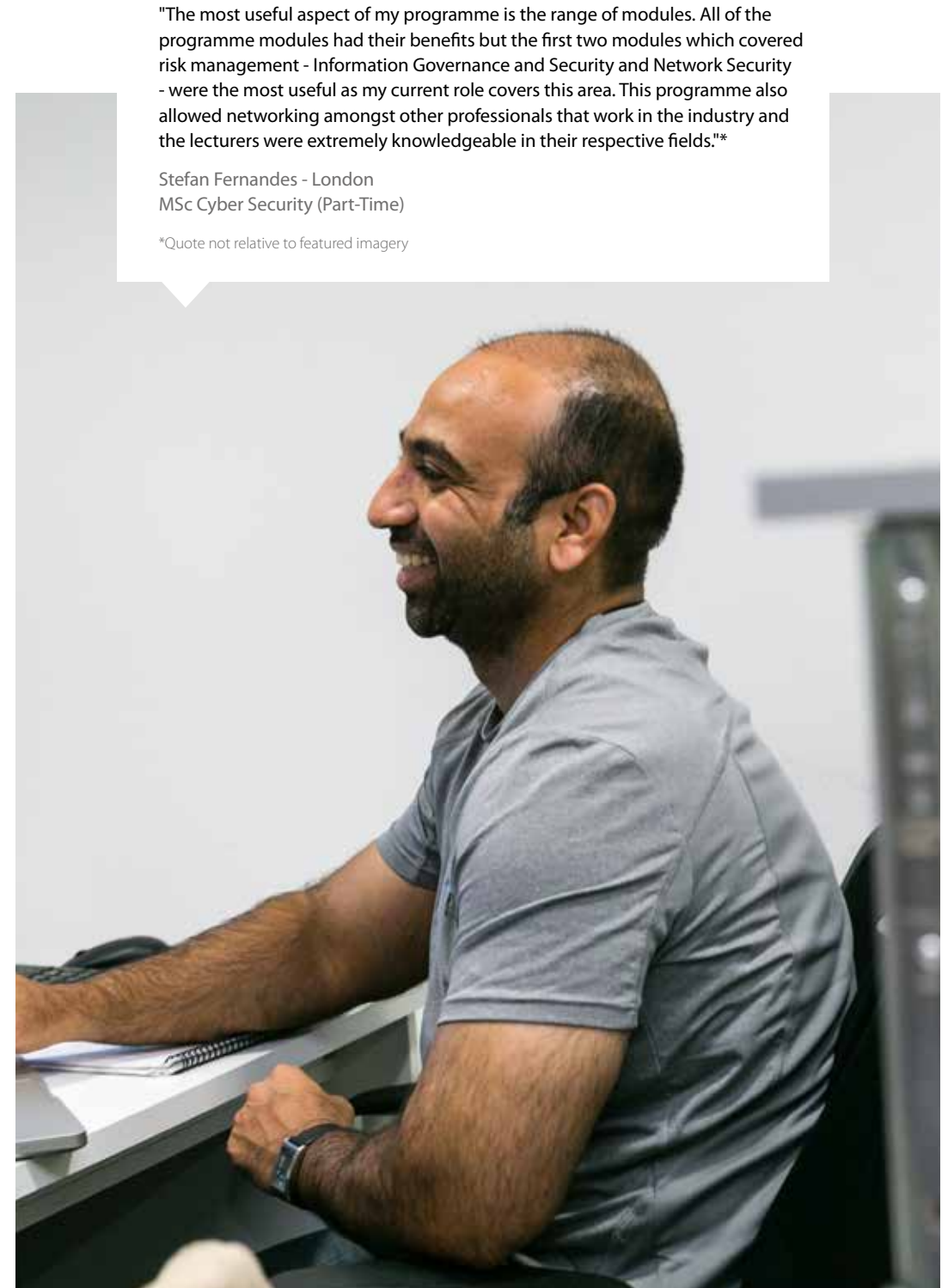

How to apply – UK and EU applicants

Both UK and European Union (EU) students follow exactly the same application process outlined below. Once you have selected a course, you need to ensure that you have, or are working towards, the appropriate entry qualifications.

Undergraduate courses

UK and EU students wishing to apply to an undergraduate programme at Northumbria University London should apply via UCAS at: ucas.com.

You may apply for up to five courses and your choices should be listed in alphabetical order. All applications are treated equally and admissions selectors will not be able to see which other institutions you have applied to, so you should not express any order of preference when you apply.

Postgraduate courses

Applications for all courses should be made direct to the University via our online application form. Simply click on the 'Apply Online' button you will see on each of our course pages: northumbria.ac.uk/london-pg. This will submit an application directly to Northumbria Admissions department.

Whilst most of our courses do not set an exact deadline for applications, you are advised to apply early to secure your place and organise any student funding.

Start exploring your options for university. Look online, go to UCAS fairs, speak to friends and family and do some research at school/college.

Shortlist

Decide on the five courses you want to apply for. They may be at different universities or all at the same – it's totally up to you.

It's time to prepare your application! Make sure you declare all your qualifications and really take your time to perfect your personal statement.

Exams

If your offers are still conditional then you need to make sure you put your very best efforts into studying hard and getting the best grades you can. If you miss your offer at Northumbria, it may still be possible to accept you, but if we can't then you may have to go to your insurance choice if you meet their conditions.

6

Choose your firm and insurance choices

Once you've received all of your decisions you need to take one as your first, or firm choice and one as your second, or insurance choice. Your first choice is the place you really want to go to – and we really hope that's Northumbria University London.

Decisions

Hopefully you'll receive offers from all of your chosen courses, which will either be unconditional if you meet all the criteria or conditional if you've still got exams to sit or have non-academic conditions. If you're unsuccessful in any of your choices, don't forget you may still be able to use UCAS Extra to make other choices.

Now you need to wait to hear from universities. You may be asked to provide further information or to go for an interview for your course. Selection processes vary for different courses.

Once we receive your fully completed application form and supporting documents, you should receive our decision within a few weeks by email, this will include any outstanding conditions that you will need to meet to satisfy the requirements for your unconditional offer.

Accepting your offer

To accept your offer you should complete and return an Offer Acceptance Form, and, unless your fees are being paid by a recognised financial sponsor, you will also need to pay a deposit and send us your Deposit Payment Form. Applicants who pay their deposit in full before advertised deadlines may also be entitled to an Early Payment Discount. Information regarding these discounts will be detailed in the offer email that we send you but you can also find out more, including Terms and Conditions, by visiting northumbria.ac.uk/london-terms

If your offer is conditional, please send us evidence that you have met the conditions of your offer as soon as possible so that we can confirm your place on your course.

Applying for a Visa

If you are coming to study a full-time course in the UK, it may be necessary for you to obtain a Tier 4 (General) Student visa. You can find out more about this at ukvisas.gov.uk



In order to apply for a Tier 4 visa, you will need a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS), which you can request on your Offer Acceptance Form once you have satisfied all conditions and paid any necessary deposit. We will email your CAS letter to the email address you have supplied on your application form. Please note, in order for you to receive your CAS in time for your visa application and the start of your course, you will need to send your offer acceptance and CAS request to us by the advertised deadlines on our website.

If you require a Tier 4 visa for studying on your new course, you must inform us of any previous Tier 4 (General) Student visas that you have held. If you are currently in the UK, you will also be required to provide a copy of your current visa. This is so we can establish whether we need to confirm on your CAS that your new course represents academic progression or complements previous studies. It will also allow us to check that you have enough time left under Tier 4 in order to complete your new course.

6

Deadlines

We strongly recommend that you apply as early as possible to allow enough time to complete all the preparations you need to make in order to study in the UK. After receiving an offer it can take several months to arrange your finances and apply for a visa and it is important that you arrive in good time for our international enrolment session.

Financial support for UK/EU students

Undergraduate Tuition Fee Loans

Tuition fee loans pay for your course and all UK/EU undergraduate students are eligible for a loan to cover the cost of these fees, regardless of your household income. Here are a few facts about how the loans work:

The money is paid directly to the University by Student Finance England (SFE) so you don't have to worry about it.

Tuition fee loans incur interest at RPI + 3%.

You don't have to start paying back the loan until the April after you graduate and are earning over £21,000 at this time. This means that if you begin an undergraduate completion award (Top-Up) with us in September 2018, your first payment won't be until April 2020 and only if you are earning £21,000 a year or more. Any earnings over this amount will see a 9% deduction as repayment towards your student loan.*

* £21,000 is the current figure for starting repayments and is liable to change in future. Any changes to this figure will be confirmed and communicated by Student Finance England.

Government Loan for Postgraduate study

UK and EU students are now able to apply for a £10,280 postgraduate loan. The loan can be used to pay your course fees and help with living expenses.

If your course lasts more than a year – for example if you're a part-time Masters student studying over two years, you can take up to £5,000 in the first year and the rest in your second year.

The repayment amount will be 6% of income above the threshold of £21,000. If you were a UK undergraduate, this is on top of the 9% you pay back on your undergraduate loan, although only on the annual income you earn over £21,000.

Instalment plan

For self-financing students studying our part-time postgraduate programmes, we are happy to offer an interest-free payment plan, allowing you to spread the cost of your course over 24 months. The first payment is due on or shortly before enrolment, with subsequent payments falling due on the first working day of each month thereafter.

Please note that instalment plans are not available to students receiving postgraduate loans.

Early payment discounts

The discount will be applied to your remaining fees after you pay your full deposit and payment has been confirmed by our Admissions Team

Please note that the discount is not available for Postgraduate Loan applicants and cannot be used in conjunction with any other offer – please contact us for more details on eligibility.

Other conditions are:

- You have already received an offer prior to payment
- You are a self-funding student starting an academic degree or diploma programme lasting at least one full academic year.
